Habilitation: <u>Legally-authorized qualification for a professorship at Universities in Central Europe and several states in East Europe, as well as the authorization at the university for mentoring Ph.D. among other candidates for academic degrees as a supervisor.</u>

It is defined in the state's law for universities (UG 2002, Republic of Austria, Articles "Habilitation"): <u>The submission for the procedure is just possible for those who have an academic degree of Ph.D. (Dr. phil., Dr. rer. nat. etc.)</u>.

The original title in the Republic of Austria: Univ.-Doz.; Universitätsdozent / venia docendi / PD In Germany and Switzerland: PD / venia legendi / Dr. habil. In Poland, amongst others: dr hab.

\*The status of the authorization by title is **distinguished clearly from that of "Lektor** /Lecturer /Univ.-Lektor" as well as from that of a "docent" in countries where there is not the same system of the "Habilitation". (State Law, UG 2002, Republic of Austria)
